The Bible, in contrast with this teaching, says that in the last days the world will be further from God's ideal rather than parallel to it (2 Timothy 3:1, 13; 2 Peter 3:3). However this mandate and teaching is based upon a false prophecy of the end times and a false understanding regarding the details of Christ's second coming. It is therefore important to beware of NAR teachings and any theology that is linked to dominionism and the Seven Mountain Mandate. The NAR and the 7 Mountain Mandate prophecy / strategy promotes a distorted gospel and a false Great Commission message. The Great Commission is not about achieving control of the world's systems but it is about sharing the true gospel which consists of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ (1 Corinthians 15:1-4). To the NAR whoever controls the 7 Mountains is the one who has all the wealth. Furthermore it distorts the true gospel of Jesus Christ and deceives people into seeking the systems of the world as being part of the Great Commission. The 7-M movement teaches followers to pursue control over civil aspects of society as a part of a worldwide kingdom for Jesus. These 7 Mountains (7-M) are the following: 1) Government/Military 2) Media 3) Family 4) Business/Finance 5) Education 6) Church/Religion 7) Arts/Entertainment It is important to note that it is not evil at all for an individual(s) to work and even excel in any of these 7 sectors. Wallnau teaches that the Abrahamic Covenant in which God promises Abraham lasting inheritance, coupled with Deuteronomy 28:12-14 that Israel should lead nations, leads to a conclusion that the Church should claim that promise and fulfill that mandate. The 7-M movement grew out of dominion theology based in Genesis 1:28, but does not interpret that Scripture correctly. In order to understand the deception of the 7 Mountain Mandate, it is important to understand 3 issues. Therefore the Bible does not promote the idea that we are to seek to control them because God prohibits us from desiring the systems of the world. Even satan knows that the Seven Mountain Mandate strategy is not achievable simply because it is not biblical. The 7 Mountain Mandate is dangerous because it somehow discounts or ignores the coming of the Antichrist. Individual Christians, Wallnau says, should take the greatest control or power over the largest mountain or peak they can in their sphere of influence. They believe that the only way for the NAR version of the "kingdom" to be established on earth is when the church has political, social and economic success through the implementation of the 7 Mountains strategy. The Bible is clear that before the second coming of Jesus Christ, it is the "man of lawlessness" or Antichrist who must come first. The 7 Mountains theology opposes the Scripture's account of what will occur before the return of Jesus Christ. The Bible is also clear that these world systems are at enmity with God because it is satan who has influence and control over them. Matthew 5:16 says: In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven. It is the very reason why the world hates Christ - it's because the systems have been created by the devil who is also described as being "the god of this world" (2 Corinthians 4:4). Proponents of the seven mountain (7-M) mandate say and teach that the Church must take control of seven important aspects of society, or "mountains," before Jesus will return to earth. The seven mountain mandate is now espoused by so-called prophets and apostles, some associated with the New Apostolic Reformation, who say they have special knowledge or revelation from God. The Great Commission has no connections to taking dominion of the world's systems. Instead the state of the world will only get worse. But My kingdom is not from the world hates you, know that it has hated Me before it hated you. It is also about the distortion that this Seven Mountain Mandate gives to the true teaching of the gospel and how we should live the Biblical Christian life. Rather, we are to share the love of God with others, stand up for His truth, and eagerly await Jesus' return when He will make all things new (Revelation 21). Though Jesus calls Christians to be lights in the world (Matthew 5:14), there is nothing in the Bible that requires or encourages them to dominate world systems to make them more like heaven and trigger Jesus' return. 2 Timothy 3:12 says "... evil people and impostors will go on from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived." According to Scripture, in the last days, the church or Christians will not be controlling the world systems just as Christians do not currently have control of these particular world systems today. The seven mountain mandate, followed by some in Charismatic and Pentecostal churches, is unbiblical, damaging to the witness of Christians, and confuses of Christians, and confuses serve." The Seven Mountain Mandate is ultimately part of the NAR deception and dominion theology which subtly leads people to seek after the ternal things that pertain to the kingdom of God. Therefore according to the NAR, the church is mandated to seek dominion over these 7 spheres of influence in order for the great wealth transfer to occur. Despite the office of apostle and prophet having ceased because of the full canon of scripture, there has been a rise in the unbiblical concept that these self-appointed prophets and apostles sit at the top of the "church hierarchy" and therefore they should also be known as "spiritual fathers", "God's generals", "spiritual coverings" and that their teachings, prophecies and extra-biblical revelations should never be questioned or tested by anyone. 2 For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, 3 heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good, 4 treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of God, 5 having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. However it's about the bad theology and false end time prophecy that these 7 mountains are meant to be "invaded" or "dominated" by Christians is where the deception truly lies. It is therefore no surprise that many leaders and followers who are linked to the prosperity gospel movement and also the word of faith movement and accommodate the New Apostolic Reformation teachings and heresies. The 7 Mountain Mandate is based on false prophesies about the end times. So since the beginning of the 21st Century there has been an incredible rise in self-appointed apostles and prophets. While Christians are called to be salt and light in the world, the Bible does not connect Christ's teachings to taking supposed dominion of the 7 mountains or to seek after these world systems. Spiritually, these ideas are closely associated with New Age thoughts that call for a spiritual shift in which humans become co-redeemers of earth. Our mandate is to preach the true gospel and to become more like Jesus Christ so that He alone receives the praise and glory. Luke 4:5-8 says: And the devil took Him up and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time, 6 and said to Him, "To You I will give all this authority and their glory, for it has been delivered to me, and I give it to whom I will. So it is not wrong if a Christian is employed or excels in his/her profession within these sectors. Whether at work, at home or in any situation in our life - our daily relationships and conduct as Christians should ultimately glorify Jesus Christ so that the lost may desire a personal relationship with Christ because of the finished work He did for us on the cross. 17 And the world is passing away along with its desires, but whoever does the will of God abides forever. 16 For all that is in the world—the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and pride in possessions—is not from the Father but is from the world. Biblically, discipling the nations is not connected to the 7 Mountains or taking dominion of these systems. 3) Misinterpretation of The Great Commission & the kingdom of God The NAR movement also believe in a distorted gospel. WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY ABOUT THE 7 MOUNTAIN MANDATE? Wallnau who expanded Jesus' Great Commission to "go and make disciples" (Matthew 28:18-20) to include social transformation. The NAR strategy of the Seven Mountain Mandate points to expectations of the arrival of a "false christ" as it distorts the Scriptures. The emphasis of achieving economic, social and political success is a deception which strays people from teaching and preaching the true gospel of Jesus Christ. They focus on control-both of society in general and of their followers by placing expectations of continual advancing upon the "mountains" making each more honoring to God. It is interesting to note that within the New Age, the one world religion and the new world order system, there is also the anticipation of a "messiah" type of figure who is to come when these movements have done the "work" required to prepare for his arrival. The very same systems being prepared to be controlled or governed by the Antichrist. Some also believe the ushering of Jesus back to earth is dependent upon them establishing moral laws and punishments based on the Old Testament. Instead according Romans 12:2 Christians should not to conform to the standards of this world nor should we seek to control them. However whatever "messiah" figure that is expected by these movements, it will be a false messiah, and will not be the true Messiah who is Jesus Christ. We should have an impact on society, but not through domination or forceful change. Christians are to shine through reflecting the nature and character of the Person of Jesus Christ. So according to NAR teachings - if the church does not achieve economic, social, cultural and political success by taking dominion of the 7 Mountains, then the church will delay the second coming of Christ. Whilst tempting Christ, the devil also made particular mention that as satan, he has power to give these worldly kingdoms to whomever he wants. He has identified the seven spheres of society in which that influence must be increased, sometimes calling them the "gates of hell" which serve as portals over the "kings" or influence-shapers. In John 18:36 Jesus said the following: "My kingdom is not of this world. In Matthew 24:1-23 Jesus Christ gives us a glimpse of some the events that will occur in the last days so that we understand our need to be ready for His second coming. The Bible also says that in the last days there will be many difficult problems and issues in the world because man's heart will grow more wicked. 4) Great wealth transfer linked to the 7 Mountains The NAR concept of God transferring wealth from the hands of the wicked is linked to the 7 Mountain Mandate. Avoid such people. The Bible is clear that in the end times true Bible believing Christians will be in the minority and that many people will depart from the true faith. For that day will not come, unless the rebellion comes first, and the man of lawlessness is revealed, the son of destruction, 4 who opposes and exalts himself against every so-called god or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of God, proclaiming himself to be God. Some point to Isaiah 2:2 which mentions the establishment of the Lord's temple on the highest mountain. Jesus Himself would speak of 2 kinds of kingdoms. 2 Thessalonians 2:1-4 says: Now concerning the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered together to him, we ask you, brothers, 2 not to be quickly shaken in mind or alarmed, either by a spirit or a spoken word, or a letter seeming to be from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord has come. Christ Himself when He spoke about the last days, He said the following in Matthew 24:4-5: "And Jesus answered them, "See that no one leads you astray. The mandate ignores the Biblical reality that the present world systems as we know them are actually being prepped or primed for the eventual arrival of the Antichrist and the 7 year tribulation that will occur. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. It is about the distorted view that the NAR have about the kingdom of God, the purpose of the Christ's Church and Jesus Christ Himself. Furthermore, before Christ returns, the entire world must be given over to a "great delusion" or deception or rebellion so that the world may easily accept the Antichrist. 5 For many will come in My name, saying, 'I am the Christ, and they will lead many astray." The Bible also says the following about what will happen in the end times: 1 Timothy 4:1-2 says: Now the Spirit expressly says that in later times some will depart from the faith by devoting themselves to deceitful spirits and teachings of demons, 2 through the insincerity of liars whose consciences are seared 2 Timothy 4:3-4 - For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, 4 and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths. However, the Bible clearly says the world will get worse rather than better before Jesus returns. The New Apostolic Reformation theology and their 7 Mountain Mandate is a deception which parallels the New Age concepts of a one world religion as well as the concept of a new world order system. He teaches that the Church, established in most every nation, has little influence on the culture around it and that must significantly change. In fact, satan not only controls these kingdoms, but the devil is also responsible for creating many of the world but we are citizens of this world but we are citizens of the world. So it is believed that whoever controls the 7 Mountains will have influence over nations and therefore this is how nations will be won to Christ for the Great Commission. It is important to understand that the NAR prediction of the end times is unbiblical and dangerous. These 7 mountains and systems are mostly created, influenced and controlled by satan who the Bible describes as "the god of this world" (2) Corinthians 4:4). The 7 Mountain Mandate also subtly deceives people into seeking to manage and control the very earthly kingdoms or systems which Jesus Christ Himself refused when He was tempted by the devil (Matthew 4:8-8). 2 Corinthians 4:4 says: In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God 3) Lastly - during a time when Jesus Christ was fasting and praying, the devil tempted Christ by offering Him "all the kingdoms of the world" in exchange for Christ's worship. The 7 Mountain Mandate is a satanic temptation of the same nature as when Christ was tempted by satan with the "kingdoms of the world" in exchange for His worship (Luke 4:5-8). Therefore according to the NAR, the Great Commission and the Seven Mountain Mandate are interlinked. To the NAR, the gospel of the kingdom" is about "the church's" effort and work to establish the "kingdom" on earth through taking dominion of the 7 mountains. NAR apostles and prophets believe that it is only they who have direct revelation from God. The 7-M movement grew as self-appointed prophets and apostles added their input based on dreams and visions and other revelations they claim to have received. According to the leaders of the New Apostolic Reformation (NAR), God in these last days will empower the church and NAR prophets and apostles to take control or dominion of 7 major institutions or 7 spheres of influence so that they may govern the nations of the world. So they believe that the longer it will take for "the church" to take dominion over the 7 Mountains, the longer it will take for "the church" to take dominion of the world's systems. 2) The church must be ruled or governed by apostles and prophets. Therefore according to the NAR it is up to Christians to excel in their various professions, jobs, sports and spheres of influence to a point where by they infiltrate and control these 7 mountains in order to expedite the return of Christ. 3 Let no one deceive you in any way. The main teacher of the 7-M movement is a man named Lance P. NAR leaders and followers of the 7 institutions. They believe that the gospel of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ is not a complete gospel. The NAR further misinterpret the words of Christ in Matthew 28:19 about making "disciples of all nations" to mean that the only way the church can "disciple nations" is by taking dominion of the 7 Mountains. The Seven Mountain Mandate theology is characterized by the following false beliefs: 1) Jesus Christ cannot return back to earth unless the church takes dominion of the 7 Mountains Therefore the NAR believe that it is "the church" that has control pertaining to when and how Christ will come times of difficulty. If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews. Sorry, but the world would love you as its own; but because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you." 2) Secondly it is imperative to understand that satan has a measure of control and influence over the systems or kingdoms of this world. Our kingdom is not of this world (John 15:18-19).
